



# COOPERATIVA TRASPORTI SCUOLA EUROPEA VARESE

Dear Parents,

The use of Via Mameli at the end of the school day is becoming ever more difficult and is now causing widespread disruption, primarily for those we are trying to look after – the students.

The buses are experiencing enormous problems, especially at the time of departure. This is resulting in long delays, meaning that, for example, pupils from the Materna are on the bus for 30 minutes before the buses even leave.

**The ban on traffic in Via Montello, after the junction with Via Marzorati, is not being adhered to and on a daily basis there are some parents who decide to park their cars in a way that contravenes the rules and impedes the passage of the buses.** The staff of the Cooperativa Trasporti have repeatedly tried to persuade these parents not to park in such a way, but have been met with indifference with regard to the rules and sometimes with rude and offensive replies.

As an example, on 7<sup>th</sup> March at approximately 16:20, a parent did not comply with the ban on proceeding up the final part of via Montello and as a result blocked the passage of many of the buses leaving the school. This parent refused to move the car, even when asked to do so by the staff of the Cooperative Transport and the bus drivers. This caused considerable disruption to hundreds of students.

Every day 1,067 students are leaving late, 86 of these are less than 6 years old. There is therefore a need for action.

**We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the ban on driving in Via Montello, from the stadium in the direction of the school, on school days from Monday to Friday between the following times:**

**08.15 - 08.45**

**13.00 - 13.15**

**16.15 - 16.30**

We would also communicate that, having failed over several months to convince some parents to follow the rules, we have requested the intervention of the appropriate authorities. Our priority must be to ensure that the students who use the bus are provided with an efficient and appropriate service.

Of course we continue to hope that the problem can be resolved by the compliance of parents with the rules and good use of common sense.
